F.S. 723.061; 723.0611; 723.06116; 723.0612	No. The amendments were to simplify certain processes, increase efficiency, and delete obsolete statutory references. The amendments to 61M-1.001 included the following: (1) removal of FMHRC's physical address from Rule 61M-1.001(4); and, (2) addition of a requirement that FMHRC include its contact information in a conspicuous place on its website. The amendments to Rule 61M-1.002 and forms incorporated by reference (English and Spanish) include the following: (1) removal of FMHRC's physical address from 61M-1.002(9) as well as Forms 1001, 1002, 1003, 1004, 1007, 1008, 1009, and 1010 (English and Spanish); (2) addition of language directing applicants and interested parties to visit FMHRC's official website to obtain FMHRC's official mailing and email addresses; (3) notice that applications may be submitted via-regular or electronic mail in Forms 1001, 1002, 1003, 1004, 1007, 1008, 1009, and 1010 (English and Spanish); (4) removal from Rule 61M-1.002(1), (3), (5), and (8) of the specific compensation amounts, because the amounts are set forth in Sections 723.06116 and 723.0612, Florida Statutes; (5) removal from Rule 61M-1.002(2) and (7) remove of language requiring that applications be collected from a P.O. Box on specific days of the week, because FMHRC will receive applications via-regular and electronic mail; and, (6) removal from Rule 61M-1.002(3), (5), and (8) references to how FMHRC compensates and handles applications received prior to June 26, 2003, and April 6, 2004.
